Targums are the Aramaic translations of the Hebrew Bible composed somewhere in the first centuries C.E. My PhD subproject focused on the Targum units contained in medieval liturgical manuscripts (*mahzorim*) and investigated how they relate to the broader corpus of Targum. This involves the collection, transcription, and alignment of over 40 manuscripts using OCR (eScriptorium) and alignment software (CollateX, Dicta), followed by a text-critical analysis of the textual variants.
